AIM:

Improve student teachers' ability and confidence in the teaching of poetry to engage Primary School sligud

> Professional Poets/ Poet Educators demonstrating performance poetry and creative presentation poetry teaching



Confidence:

Student teachers increased confidence in understanding. responding to and teaching poetry including creative use of drama and music

Enthusiasm:

Student teachers' enthusiasm was boosted by positive personal experiences of teaching poetry, the enthusiasm of the poet educator, lecturers and fellow students

Skills:

Student teachers better understood the value of sharing poetry, were more informed about resources; and more interactive ways of teaching poetry in cross curricular ways

Starting point:

Student teachers lacking enthusiasm. skills and confidence for teaching poetry
