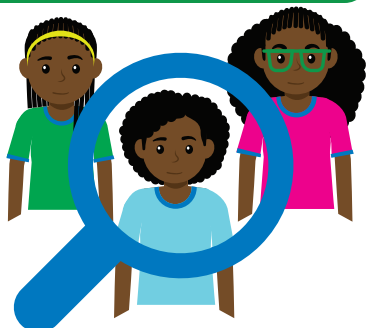


TEACHER TRAINING FOR INCLUSIVE GIRLS' EDUCATION (TTIGE) IN SIERRA LEONE

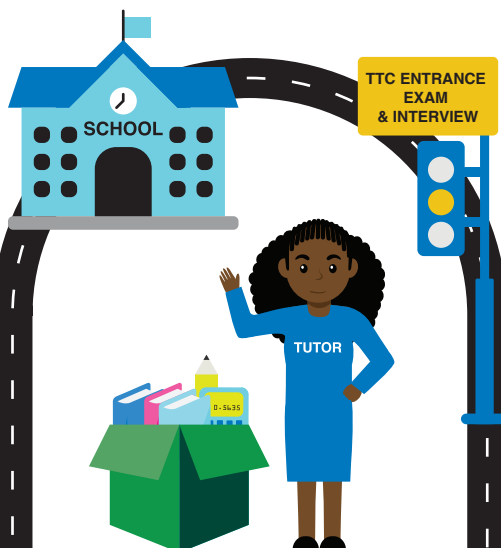
1 COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND PARTICIPANT SELECTION



- Community leaders form selection/recruitment committees
- 210 young women (aged 18–26) are selected to participate, based on their willingness to teach

LEARNING ASSISTANT (LA) PHASE – 1 YEAR

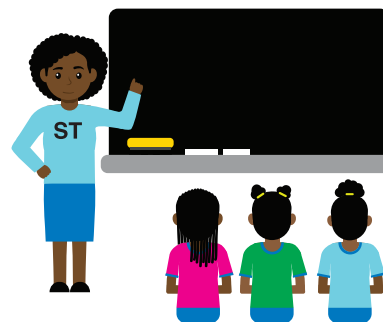


- The participants prepare for their entrance exams into Teacher Training College (TTC)
- Each LA is assigned to a teacher at a local primary school & spends 3 days/week assisting them
- LAs are provided with Math & English self-study material and support from assigned tutors



During the LA & ST Phases, stipends are provided to cover transport & food costs

TTC ENTRANCE EXAM & INTERVIEW



- Participants enroll in TTC through a Teachers' Certification Distance Program
- Now designated as STs, they take on a more active role in their assigned classrooms
- STs meet with their Practice Study Mentors for academic and social support 2–4x/week
- STs will attend TTC in person during residential camp periods



The TTIGE program is officially recognized by the Government of Sierra Leone and the Teacher Service Commission

4 QUALIFIED TEACHERS



- Participants are now trained to be professional teachers and can be employed by the Teacher Service Commission
